> We were furnished copies of deferrals and proposed rescissions which the President submitted to the Congress on July 1 in his first special message for fiscal year 1976 pursuant to the Impoundment Control Act of 1974. The special message transmits three rescission proposals and 27 deferrals. The President estimates that the impoundments will reduce fiscal year 1976 outlays by \$160.4 million. Enclosure I summarizes, by agency, the total budget authority and FY 1976 outlay reductions involved in the message.

> The Impoundment Control Act requires us to review each message and report promptly to the House and Senate as to the facts surrounding each action, including the probable effect thereof and, in the case of deferrals, to render a judgment as to whether the action is in accordance with existing legal authority. Enclosure II contains our comments on each impoundment transmitted by the President's July 1 special message.

Information in the above messages is essentially correct and the actions being proposed are reasonably clear. With respect to R76-2, however, we noted that DOT's FY 1976 appropriation bill (H.R. 8365) contains language that would rescind the \$25 million in contract authority and replace it with a regular appropriation. H.R. 8365 passed the House on July 10.

The information provided is essentially correct and the action being taken is reasonably clear. The funds are being deferred pending the outcome of *e* report on alternative plans for the Second Bacon Siphon and Tunnel and the Development of the East High-East Low area of the Columbia Basin Project, Washington. The Bureau of Reclamation has scheduled the report for completion by September 1, 1975, rather than November 1, 1975, as stated in the message. Based on study results to date, the Bureau was prepared to award a contract for construction of the Second Bacon Siphon and Tunnel in September 1975. OMB, however, did not approve the Bureau's request that the funds be apportioned for obligation in the first quarter of FY 1976. The deferral is in accordance with the authority conferred by the Antideficiency Act (31 U.S.C. 665). The authority exists until either House of the Congress passes a resolution disapproving the action.

Construction funds totalling \$1,150,000 are being deferred pending the completion of salinity effect studies. Studies of the Savery Pot Hook and Fruitland Mesa projects were completed and reports were forwarded to OMB in June 1975. The Dallas Creek and Jensen Unit studies will be completed and reports forwarded to OMB during the latter part of the calendar year. The Bureau planned to obligate the funds during the first quarter of FY 1976 but OMB did not approve the Bureau's apportionment request. The deferral is in accordance with the authority conferred by the Antideficiency Act (31 U.S.C. 665). The authority exists until either House of the Congress passes a resolution disapproving the action.
