

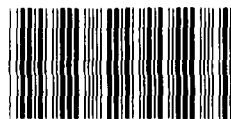

Dear Mr. Chairman:

As requested in your January 16, 1986, letter and in subsequent discussions with your office, this fact sheet presents Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) obligations and outlays for fiscal years 1976 through 1985. As you requested, we also prepared (1) a description of the legislative authorities, restrictions, and prohibitions governing recreational fees charged by federal agencies and (2) an inventory and budget summary for each of the recreational and cultural sites maintained by the Bureau of Land Management. We will provide the results on the latter two issues in separate reports.

As agreed with your office, due to the way agency records are maintained, we are showing LWCF outlays (expenditures) by agency and state fiscal year totals. Obligations, however, are shown by project and fiscal year for federal projects and by grant category and fiscal year for LWCF grants to states. In addition, the types of state and local recreation facilities (campgrounds, picnic areas, etc.) are ranked in order of the frequency in which they received LWCF matching grants. This ranking information covers the period from fiscal year 1965 through calendar year 1985.

The LWCF program was enacted by the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965 (Public Law 88-578) to serve as a funding source for federal acquisition of public park and recreation lands and for grants-in-aid to state and local governments for the planning, acquisition, and development of outdoor recreation areas. The LWCF is currently authorized to receive \$900 million annually from Outer Continental Shelf mineral receipts, federal surplus property sales, motorboat fuel taxes, and recreation fees. Between fiscal years 1965 and 1985, LWCF income totaled \$10.2 billion. The Congress appropriated \$6.4 billion from the LWCF, leaving an unappropriated balance of \$3.8 billion at the end of fiscal year 1985. The Fund is divided into

two portions: the "federal" side and "state" side. Not less than 40 percent of any appropriation made goes toward acquisition of land at federal sites with the remainder, (up to 60 percent), as designated by Congress, for LWCF matching grants to the states. Between fiscal years 1976 and 1985, annual federal outlays from the fund averaged \$227 million and state outlays averaged \$203 million a year.


The federal agencies eligible to use LWCF are the Department of Interior's Bureau of Land Management, Fish and Wildlife Service, and National Park Service, and the Department of Agriculture's Forest Service. From fiscal year 1976 through 1985, federal agency obligations totaled \$2.2 billion, outlays totaled \$2.3 billion, and land acquired or expected to be acquired totaled 1.8 million acres.

The National Park Service is responsible for administering the LWCF matching grants-in-aid program to state and local governments. For the 10-year period reviewed, obligations to states were \$1.8 billion, outlays totaled \$2 billion, and 1.5 million acres were acquired or expected to be acquired. From fiscal year 1965 through calendar year 1985, recreation support facilities (walkways, lighting, comfort stations, etc.) received the greatest number of LWCF matching grants and sheltered pools received the fewest.

We obtained the information contained in this fact sheet from the National Park Service's Land Resources Division, Recreation Grants Division, and Finance Office; the Bureau of Land Management's Division of Rights-of-Way; the Fish and Wildlife Service's Division of Realty; and the Forest Service's Lands Staff Unit. We interviewed officials in these offices when further clarification or explanation of the information was needed. Our review was made between January 27, 1986 and March 24, 1986. As agreed with your office, to expedite this fact sheet, we did not verify the LWCF figures agencies provided to us.

As agreed with your office, unless you publicly announce its contents earlier, we plan no further distribution of this fact sheet until 30 days from the date of this letter. Section 1

FEDERAL AGENCIES' LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION FUND

OBLIGATIONS AND OUTLAYS

The federal portion of the Land and Water Conservation (LWCF) is used to acquire lands, waters, and interests necessary to achieve the natural, cultural, wildlife, and recreation management objectives of the National Park Service (NPS), the Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS), the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), and the Forest Service (FS). Lands acquired through the Fund by these agencies must be authorized by law.

In addition, as authorized by the National Parks and Recreation Act of 1978 (Public Law 95-625) LWCF is used to assist New Jersey in planning and acquiring lands and waters within the Pinelands National Reserve. The Pinelands program combines the capabilities and resources of the federal, state, and local governments and the private sector. Between fiscal years 1982 and 1985, LWCF obligations to the Pinelands totaled \$11.1 million and outlays amounted to \$9.5 million.

Section 1 presents the federal agencies' obligations and outlays from LWCF for fiscal years 1976 through 1985. Table 1.1 summarizes the agencies' obligations and number of acres acquired or expected to be acquired through these obligations. Table 1.2 summarizes federal expenditures or outlays for this 10-year period. The remaining tables in this section break out each agency's obligations and acquisition by fiscal year and project. For NPS, FWS, and FS, the number of acres shown represents the land expected to be acquired through the obligations made in that fiscal year, although the acres may not have actually been acquired in that fiscal year. Due to variations in agency recordkeeping, BLM acres are shown under the fiscal year actually acquired.

Some of the LWCF obligations were made for allowable purposes other than actual land acquisition. For example, administrative expenses for land acquisition are included in the project obligations for fiscal years 1976 through 1981. In fiscal year 1982, the Congress added a line-item appropriation entitled "acquisition management" to provide for administrative expenses. While not all of the agencies use these funds in precisely the same manner, they are used for acquisition-related expenses such as personnel costs, survey and title work, recording fees, and for costs associated with alternatives to land purchases, such as exchanges. Another example of Fund obligations made for purposes other than land acquisition is NPS' fiscal years 1984 and 1985 LWCF obligations for "Emergency Law Enforcement." According to an NPS Lands Coordination and Controls officer, regular appropriations for law enforcement were insufficient in these fiscal years, and as authorized by law, other available funds were used to meet this need.

In several of the tables included in this section, obligations are listed without any corresponding acreage. According to agency officials, reasons for this occurrence are due to

- start-up costs (land surveys, title work, etc.) rather than land acquisition;
- anticipated costs for land acquisition in condemnation cases. In most of these situations, the acreage will show up in the year the actual court award/settlement is made;
- deficiency costs in land condemnation cases, whereby the court awarded more compensation to the landowner than the agency anticipated. In some cases, this balance due will be shown under the listing "deficiencies," or
- the listing of acreage under the year actually acquired in the BLM tables.

Conversely, some of the tables in this section show acreage without corresponding obligations. Agency officials stated that this could be due to one of the following reasons

- in condemnation cases, acreage is often shown in the year the court award/settlement is made;
- acquisition of land through exchanges or donations;
- later-year correction to prior land survey errors; or
- listing of acreage under the year actually acquired for the BLM tables.

Negative obligations or deobligations are shown for a few NPS projects. According to an NPS Lands Coordination and Control officer, these deobligations could be due to

- anticipated acquisition through condemnation not materializing or
- court awards being less than anticipated in condemnation cases.

In some of these situations, acreage might be listed because despite the deobligation, land was still acquired. Another reason could be due to the project receiving an obligation and deobligation in the same year. If the deobligation was larger than the obligation, this would result in a net deobligation, while the acreage expected to be acquired would still be shown.

The FWS tables show obligations under listings other than projects. According to an FWS Realty Specialist, the uses of these listings include:

--Emergencies: used for needed acquisitions where project funds have not yet been appropriated. "Contingencies" obligations are also made for this purpose.

--Uncommitted funds: funds currently not designated for a specific project that will be transferred to a project at a later date.

The FS tables also show obligations under listings other than projects. According to an FS Lands Specialist, the uses of these listings include:

--Composite and inholdings: composite refers to lands not specifically designated for acquisition by the Congress but deemed to be of significant recreational value by FS. Inholdings, refer to private lands acquired within or adjacent to FS lands.

--Cash equalization: funds used to cover the differences in land values in land exchanges.

--Other: land acquisitions not readily identifiable by project name.

Section 2

LWCF OBLIGATIONS AND OUTLAYS TO STATES

The Land and Water Conservation Fund provides funds to the 50 states (also Guam, the Northern Marianas, American Samoa, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, and the District of Columbia) for the acquisition and development of new and existing outdoor recreation areas. An additional LWCF objective is to stimulate, through its planning and matching requirements, greater nonfederal and private investments in the provision and maintenance of outdoor recreation facilities. Fifty percent matching grants are available to the states and through the states to local units of government. Recreation areas receiving LWCF monies range from densely populated metropolitan areas to wilderness sites. The types of recreation facilities receiving LWCF monies also vary considerably. Examples include: bicycle paths, sports fields, roadside picnic grounds, swimming complexes, and boating facilities.

The LWCF program is administered at the federal level by the National Park Service (NPS) through eight NPS regional offices. Project proposals are submitted to NPS regional offices through the state agency or individuals authorized to represent the state for LWCF matters. The states are responsible for analyzing needs, determining priorities for funding projects, supervising projects, and ensuring program compliance with federal regulations and administrative guidelines affecting the program.

Section 2 shows the obligations and outlays from LWCF for matching grants to states for fiscal years 1976 through 1985. Table 2.1 summarizes the obligations and acres acquired or expected to be acquired through LWCF funding. Table 2.2 summarizes outlays from LWCF for this 10-year period. Outlays for fiscal years 1976 and 1977 are shown together due to the way agency records were maintained. Table 2.3 ranks in order of frequency the types of recreation facilities that have received LWCF monies from fiscal year 1965 through calendar year 1985. Recreation support facilities (walkways, lighting, comfort stations, etc.) received the greatest number of LWCF matching grants (24,663) and sheltered pools received the fewest (17). The remaining tables in this section show LWCF obligations broken out by fiscal year, state, and grant category--planning, acquisition, development, redevelopment, and combination. A project with acquisition and development and/or redevelopment is listed as a combination grant; a project with development and redevelopment is listed as a development grant. The tables also show the acres acquired or expected to be acquired by the states with LWCF funding. When LWCF funds are added to or taken away from a state or local project, the changes are reflected in the year in which the project first received obligations.
