Dear Sir.

We have made a survey of controls over processing of automated civilian payrolls prepared by the 1139th Comptroller Services Squadron, Headquarters Command, United States Air Force. Our survey was made during the period May 24, 1972, through July 3, 1972.

The survey focused on identifying internal controls over (1) movement of data from point of origin to the payroll office, (2) processing of data by the payroll office, (3) conversion of data to computer-readable form, (4) movement of data from the payroll office to the computer, (5) processing of data by the computer, (6) delivery of computer output data to the payroll office, (7) comparison and reconciliation of input data with output data, and (8) correction of erroneous data. We also inquired into separation of duties among employees involved in the payroll processing, adequacy of payroll system documentation, security of payroll data and program computer tapes, payroll disaster procedures in effect, and internal audit performed on the payroll.

The controls, procedures, and documentation we identified appeared adequate to assure management that the payroll system is functioning properly. We did note that there was an opportunity to expand the degree of coverage of internal audit surveys performed by the Air Force Auditor General's office. We discussed this matter with the Auditor General's representative and he agreed that future internal audit surveys of civilian payroll would be more comprehensive, thus providing management greater assurance that the complete payroll system is functioning properly.

We wish to acknowledge the courtesies and cooperation extended to our representatives during this survey.
