## Status of Flag Officers Selectees, and Billets

Dear Mr. Ireland:
As you requested, we verified the number of Navy flag officers on active duty ${ }^{1}$ as of February 1, 1991. More specifically, this report discusses the number of (1) flag officers and flag officer selectees and (2) flag officer billets that the Navy manages.

## Results in Brief

As of February 1, 1991, there were 259 paid Navy flag officers on act duty. However, one was not charged against the Navy's end strength limitation. In addition, 73 other officers have been selected and are awaiting promotion to flag rank.

The number of flag officer billets reported as of February 1, 1991, wa 404. The Navy manages all billets that are designated as flag officer $k$ lets regardless of the pay grades of the officers filling them or whethe they are vacant.

Number of Flag Officers and Selectees

Table 1 shows, by pay grade, the number of Navy officers being paid flag rank.

A rear admiral fills the position titled "Physician to Congress," and, according to Department of Defense (DOD) officials, that position was charged against the end-strength limitation (258) being managed in $D$ as of February 1, 1991. Both Office of the Secretary of Defense and Navy officials agree that the number of Navy admirals, not counting 1

[^0]one filling the Physician to Congress position, is 258. In exempting the Physician to the Congress, dod relies on Public Law 92-607, dated October 31, 1972, which states that "the incumbent [attending physician to the United States Congress] shall be considered to hold the rank of Rear Admiral, Medical Corps, United States Naval Reserve, for all purposes..." We determined the number of admirals was within the pay grade limitations contained in subsections of 10 U.S.C. 525.

In addition to the 259 flag officers, we identified another 73 Navy captains ( $0-6 \mathrm{~s}$ ) who, as of February 1, 1991, were awaiting promotion to flag rank. Of these 73 captains, 21 were filling 0-7 flag billets and authorized to wear the insignia/uniform of a flag officer (frockings), 21 were filling $0-7$ flag billets but wearing a captain's insignia/uniform, and 31 were serving in $0-6$ billets, in training or between assignments.

Frocking is an administrative mechanism that is used by the Secretaries of the military departments to grant officers who have been selected for promotion and confirmed by the U.S. Senate and who are serving in a billet of the higher grade, but not yet promoted, the right to wear the insignia and uniform and assume the title of the next higher grade. Such officers do not (1) receive pay at the next higher grade, (2) gain seniority on the active duty list, (3) accumulate time in grade, or (4) assume the legal authority of the higher grade. A DOD directive provides a standardized frocking policy among the services and sets the aggregate limit (95) on the number of officers who can be frocked to the O-7 level at any one time. As of February 1, 1991, the Navy's allocated limit on frockings was 29.

DOD reported that 301 Navy flag officers and flag officer selectees were assigned, as of February 1, 1991, to 0-7 through 0-10 worldwide flag billets (see table 2).

## Number of Flag Officer Billets

The Navy reported that, as of February 1, 1991, it was managing 404 billets classified at the flag level. Table 3 shows the status of those billets.

## Scope and Methodology

We verified the number of flag officers by comparing and reconciling $t$ names of those reported by the Office of the Secretary of Defense to those paid by the Navy. Regarding billets, we obtained data and views from joint officials in the Office of the Secretary of Defense and from Navy officials. We conducted our work in March and April 1991 in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards. A requested, we did not obtain formal agency comments; however, we di discuss the matters contained in this report with DoD officials during o review and incorporated their comments where appropriate.

Unless you publicly announce its contents earlier, we plan no further distribution of this report until 5 days from its issue date. At that time we will send copies to the Chairmen, House and Senate Committees on Appropriations and on Armed Services; the Secretaries of Defense and the Navy; and the Director, Office of Management and Budget.
